

Summer Reading Requirements

5th Grade– *Shiloh*

Students entering the 5th grade are required to read Phyllis Reynolds Naylor's book, *Shiloh*, prior to the beginning of the first day of school. Students are also required to complete the attached packet of questions over the book. These are due on the first day back to school. Students will take a novel test during the first week of school.

Please stress to your child the importance of reading over the summer break. Reading keeps the brain active, helps students practice important reading skills, and improves processing skills.
